REPORT ON ADMINISTRATIVE PROFESSIONALS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (APDP) SURVEY RESULTS

As requested during the 45th AGM held on 27 August 2016, one of the first tasks for Management Council 2016/2017 was to carry out a survey on the feasibility of the Association launching the Administrative Professionals Development Programme (APDP).

In order to ensure as large a number of respondents as possible, an online as well as hard copy survey was carried out together with an incentive e-voucher for redemption at any SAAP event, valid until 31 August 2017.

A total of 30 survey forms were received from members and non-members of whom 57% were either very interested or interested to take up the APDP, with 17% stating they were not sure. Interestingly, 70% of the respondents had attended a training/workshop or seminar in the past year, 53% of whom were sponsored by their employer.

Only 26% indicated their non-interest or inability to take up the APDP. Reasons given varied from family commitments or having already taken up the topics proposed.

Below is the detailed breakdown of responses on the proposed topics.
